Creating Trauma-Informed Schools and Classrooms



Dr. Eric Rossen

Eric Rossen, PhD, NCSP, is a Nationally Certified School Psychologist, licensed psychologist in Maryland, and a credentialed National Register Health Service psychologist. He has experience working in public schools as well as in independent practice, has served as a college instructor and adjunct faculty at the University of Missouri and Prince George's Community College, and is currently the director of professional development and standards for the National Association of School Psychologists (NASP). Dr. Rossen has published numerous articles, manuscripts, and book chapters, and presented internationally on trauma-informed approaches in schools. Dr. Rossen is co-editor of *Supporting and Educating Traumatized Students: A Guide for School-Based Professionals* from Oxford University Press, and co-author of *Applying a Trauma-Informed Framework to the IEP Process: From Referral to Development* from LRP Publications. Description

As districts increasingly recognize the impact of stress, adversity, and trauma on students, schools must now consider how to implement these trauma-informed approaches within their unique contexts, all while balancing existing demands and school-wide initiatives. This session will help prepare school psychologists with the fundamentals of providing trauma-informed approaches in our schools, both in the immediate aftermath of COVID-19 and in the long-term.

Learning Objectives

Participants will be able to:

- Define and describe a trauma informed approach, including the principles for Compassionate Schools;
- Apply practical, implementable Tier 1 and Tier 2 strategies at the district and classroom levels to support students with a history of adversity or trauma;
- Make decisions regarding trauma screening and assessment;
- Discuss relevant school or district policies that promote a trauma-informed school environment within an MTSS framework;
- Apply a trauma-informed approach to IEP development;
- Ensure a school culture that minimizes secondary traumatic stress among staff.

Ethics in School Psychology

Dr. John Garruto is currently CoChair of the NASP Ethics and Professional Practices Board as well as Immediate Past President and Ethics and Professional Practices Committee CoChair of the New York Association of School Psychologists. Dr. Garruto also served on the writing team for the revision of the 2020 NASP Standards for Ethical and Professional Practice. He has worked as a school psychologist for 24 years and is currently employed by the Oswego City School District in Oswego, NY. He regularly engages in adjunct instruction at the State University of New York College at Oswego and maintains a private practice. His primary interests are for the assessment of learning disabilities, neuropsychology, and the ethical and professional practice of school psychology. He has also authored and co-authored book chapters on emotional neuropsychology, report writing, and is also co-author of the book "Essentials of Woodcock-Johnson IV Tests of Cognitive Abilities."



Description:

This three-hour session will review frameworks for the ethical practice of school psychology. A review of the NASP 2020 Ethical Standards will be discussed as well as how to apply a problem-solving model for solving ethical dilemmas. Finally, strategies for dealing with administrative pressure will also be reviewed.

Learning outcomes:

1. Understand the framework for the 2020 NASP Principles for Professional Ethics as well as identify where to find and how to apply the principles and standards
2. Understand a problem-solving model for solving ethical dilemmas, as well as be able to apply this model in either contrived or real-life ethical dilemmas.
3. Learn and apply at least two techniques for dealing with administrative pressure to practice unethically.

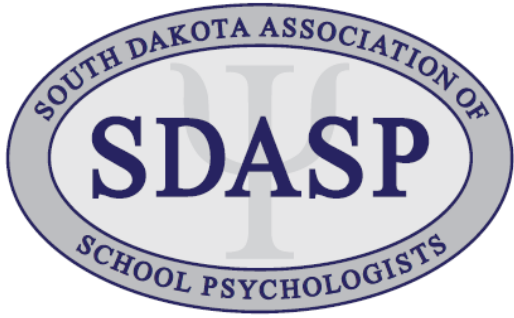
